

## SELECTMEN'S CORNER

Dear Stonington Residents,

All of the important work underway in the Town is thanks to the efforts of many different people coming together, including staff, volunteers and other community partners. We are grateful for all the time and effort put forth by so many people working to improve our community. Recently we were reminded of the motto of our local rotary clubs "service above self".

There are so many who make our community so special, and we wanted to dedicate this update to highlighting some of the work taken on by the Town of Stonington staff.

In looking at our Town's budget, all the work undertaken by our municipal government falls into five categories: General Government (which includes Administrative Services, Assessment, Finance, First Selectman, Planning, Tax Collection & Town Clerk); Human Services; Police; Public Works (which includes Highway, Engineering, Facilities; Building; Solid Waste and WPCA) and our school system.

The dedicated work taken on by those who work for the Town of Stonington is too vast to fit into this update, but we have pulled a few highlights below.

Human Services has a mission to foster a more collaborative community by connecting residents with resources, support and facilities that provide the framework for a healthy and fulfilling life in the Town of Stonington. The Department is comprised of four divisions: Social Services, Recreation, Youth and Family Services and Senior Services. This team runs our Town's summer camp, they offer specialized case management home visits for residents in need of cognitive support, such as those with Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia. They run our new Housing Rehabilitation Program, providing loans for low to moderate income property owners for eligible housing rehabilitation work. They also oversee the Juvenile Diversion Board and Prevention Council.

The Solid Waste Office has responsibility for the operation of the Transfer Station, oversight of the Commercial and Residential Municipal Solid Waste Collection Programs, Recycling Collection and Education Programs and is Stonington's representative on the Southeastern Connecticut Regional Resources Recovery Authority (SCRRRA). They have made Stonington a leader in the State for sustainability initiatives aimed at reducing our waste stream. Thanks to their efforts, in addition to traditional recycling, we have taken food waste, textiles, and plastic film (i.e., produce or dry-cleaning bags) from our trash stream.

The Public Works Department is responsible for our local infrastructure and a wide range of services, including: 2,370 Roadway Signs; 116 miles of road system; 45 miles of stormwater drainage pipe; 44 miles

of sidewalks; 1,600 catch basins, 359 outfalls, and over 6 detention\retention ponds; 45 Historic Cemeteries; 17 Bridge Structures; 8 athletic turf fields; 4 parks and one Hurricane Protection system. The Department



provides direct services to the community through snow removal, emergency response, community event support, maintaining and improving our roadways, proactively improving stormwater management and resolving issues along the road right of way.

The Department of Planning manages Stonington's land use decision-making, permitting and enforcement processes. The Department provides technical assistance to several commissions and also leads long-range planning initiatives such as the Plan of Conservation and Development. The Department also assists with various special grant-related projects, such as the Mystic River Boathouse Park project. The Department's other main responsibility is enforcement of the Town's land use regulations on behalf of relevant commissions.

The Stonington Police Department provides a diverse range of services to residents and visitors. They respond to a variety of calls that consist of criminal complaints, medical calls, motor vehicle accidents and mental health assistance. The town, along with its nonprofits and businesses, host many events throughout the year requiring police services. The department continues to operate a Marine Unit for our large coastline and provide Animal Control services to the town. They also provide outreach and educational programs for the schools and residents. In a recent review of the many thank you letters the men and women of the Stonington Police Department receive it was clear how compassionate, hardworking and devoted our team is and we are extremely grateful for work they undertake every day, at all hours of the day and night.

To all those doing the work that makes the Town of Stonington what it is, we wish to extend a very sincere thank you. Thank you for being part of our community and being a big part, often behind the scenes, in what makes our community so special.

Be on the look-out for your reminder postcard for second installments for Real Estate and Personal Property taxes. Postcards will be mailed the beginning of December. Second installments are due January 1, 2024 and the last day to pay without interest and penalty is February 1, 2024.

Automobiles registered after October 1, 2022 will be receiving a Supplemental Motor Vehicle bill at the end of December and are payable January 1, 2024 – February 1, 2024.



# Affordable Homeownership Is The Answer

The images of Habitat for Humanity are iconic. President and Rosalynn Carter looking at blueprints. Friends and neighbors posing with hammers on a weekend morning. A group of college students raising a wall. Is that Garth Brooks in a hardhat...?

But heartwarming images don't always tell the full story. In fact, the most common myth about Habitat is we build homes and give them away to low-income families. As a result, people will often ask what they have to do to "get" a home.



Well, the first lesson is learning about what Habitat really is; specifically, that the endgame for qualifying families is an affordable, interest-free mortgage. Once that's cleared up, you just need to answer one important question...

Do you want to be a homeowner?

Ask any of our current homeowner partners – this commitment is about so much more than just moving into a new house. Habitat homes provide families who have struggled in less-than-adequate circumstances stability and peace of mind. They know they are safe, they have room to grow, and they understand the costs. But there are valuable hidden lessons, as well.

- How to be a good neighbor.
- There will always be a to-do list.
- Ants come in multiple shapes, colors, and sizes, and they're all after different things.
- When your breaker pops, your stove won't turn on, your drain clogs...there's no landlord to call.
- If you forget to close your windows before a big storm...you probably won't forget twice!

Sound scary? Maybe, but it's also empowering. Homeownership is the largest source of wealth for US households. It affords you privacy and freedom. You decide what kind of home you want, and it's your canvas to paint. You can show off your style to friends and family, play games, cook meals, celebrate holidays, birthdays, or Tuesdays! Even better, you can retire to your couch at the end of each day knowing you worked hard, but also knowing exactly what you're working towards.

Affordable homeownership improves your life, and the lives of those around you. Once the fear and

uncertainty of an unsettled living situation subside, more energy is focused on the classroom, or in the office. Families might find the time and strength to make friends with their neighbors, form new social circles, and participate in community activities.

Here in New London County, the current median rent for a 2-bedroom apartment is \$1,900/month. Housing is deemed affordable if your costs don't exceed 30% of your gross pay. Consider a single parent who works full-time, 40 hours/week making \$25/hour. The average apartment costs this family almost half of their pre-tax wages. It doesn't sound sustainable, but families are living this every day. Even if they're making it work, they're likely not saving much.

Habitat for Humanity believes that affordable homeownership is the answer for families who can't afford to buy or rent in this market. Financial literacy courses, as well as learning how to budget and save, are all part of the Habitat program. A fixed monthly payment allows you to plan for your expenses or pay down debt. Best of all, you're now building equity, and have something you can pass on in the future.



Even though the myth of giving away houses is busted (and yes, that was Garth), please call, write or stop by the office to find out about our next application period. It's the first step in a million you'll take along the way, but that path will lead you right through your own front door.
