



### Department of Assessment

The Department of Assessment would like to notify all residents that the Homeowners-Totally Disabled Program and the Additional Veteran Program opens for applications February 1st, 2023. The application period for the Homeowners ends on May 15, 2023 and the Additional Veterans ends on September 29, 2023. Both of these programs are income based with the maximum income for a single person being \$40,300 and for married couples \$49,100. The Board of Assessment Appeals will be meeting during the month of April to hear real estate, personal property and motor vehicle appeals for the 2022 Grand List. Petitions are available on the Department of Assessment's website as well as in the office. Petitions must be received in the office by March 20th, 2023.



### **Shellfish Commission**

The Stonington Shellfish Commission would like to remind all residents and seasonal tax paying residents that the recreational shellfish season is fast approaching, and shellfish permits are required to shellfish in the recreational beds of Stonington waters.

Permits are available for sale at Don's Dock at 228 North Water Street, Stonington and at Town Hall. Residents need to show identification of residency and seasonal tax paying residents should bring a utility bill with their Stonington address to qualify for resident shellfish permit status.

The Commission is pleased to announce that recreational areas A & B to the East of Mason's Island and outer Quiambaug Cove this past fall and early winter have been seeded with approximately 3,000 clams and payment in kind of thousands of oysters from our commercial growers. The Commission expects that in early spring, its long term seeding program for the recreational beds will continue.

### **Food Waste Collection**

The Solid Waste Department is excited to announce the Food Waste Curbside Collection pilot program has begun! The program is made possible by a Sustainable Materials Management Grant from CT DEEP. Households that did not receive a mailer detailing the program can stop by the Solid Waste Dept in the Town Hall and pick up a free 4 gallon green bucket and 50 green bags or call 860-535-5099 for more information. F.E. Crandall Disposal will be picking up the green bags that residents have filled with separated food waste from the non-recyclable trash of their yellow bag on their regularly scheduled trash day.



Acceptable material for the new green bag: Meat, Poultry (bones included), Fish (does NOT include shellfish), Dairy Products – Cheese, yogurt, Flower & Vegetable Garden Waste (NO soil), Houseplants & Flower Bouquets, Fruits & Nuts (including pits)

Vegetables (Remove stickers, bands and ties), Bread, Pasta & Grains, Sauces, Soup & Gravy, Coffee Grounds & Filters, Tea Bags, Egg Shells, Plate Scrapings

Food waste comprises over 20% of the waste stream and only about 4% is diverted from disposal. This pilot program allows residents to separate heavy wet food waste from trash, allowing the food scraps to be recovered and turned into renewable energy through anaerobic digestion and save on the number of yellow bags your household needs!

### **Stormwater Awareness**

One of the most concerning pollutants in the Long Island Sound is bacteria from stormwater runoff. In urban and recreational areas, pet waste is often cited as causing high levels of bacteria. This is why picking up after your pet and disposing of the waste in a proper manner is an important way to contribute towards cleaner water all around us. There are several locations in Stonington where dog waste stations are provided to make it more convenient for our citizens to help keep our public areas and water clean.

In Cottrell Park there are stations for when you are enjoying a stroll or dinner with your pet in Downtown Mystic. These were donated by Mystic Pet Shop and the trash here is collected by Stonington Public Works regularly. In The Stonington Borough, at the walking park next to the docks, these stations have been provided and maintain by the Stonington Borough Highway and Parks Department. Additionally, in Spellman Park, several

dog waste stations and extra trash cans were installed and are maintained by the Stonington Public Works Department with assistance from the Recreation Department. These stations are provided to promote cleaner waters, downtowns, and recreational areas but please don't forget to bring a bag with you even when walking in open space parks or along your road.

### **Stonington Energy Fair**

The 2023 Stonington Energy Fair planned for March 25th at Mystic Aquarium is generating a lot of buzz. So much, in fact, that organizers are asking the community to help better define the event's goals and program.

Developed by the Stonington Climate Change Taskforce in cooperation with the Economic Development Commission, the Energy Fair is planned to feature the latest EV automobiles and bikes, electric yard tools, residential and commercial batteries, solar, geothermal, heat pumps and other energy and conservation technologies. Talks and presentations by financial specialists, energy consultants and system installers will round out the day.

Sound like too much? Maybe! The organizers have produced a short (five questions) opinion survey to get your input on some very relevant questions. Your answers will help ensure the Energy Fair is successful for everyone, and guide the Town's own energy and conservation intiatives.
