

SELECTMEN'S CORNER

Dear Stonington Residents,

We are asking all residents and visitors to please continue to remain diligent in taking all COVID-19 precautions possible. In Southeastern CT we are experiencing higher numbers than we did in April and all need to do our part to ensure that does not continue.

Although there is no singular reason for this increase, our partners at LLHD have reported their contact tracers have observed many instances connected to social gatherings, as well as sporting events. To date, cases associated with institutions (schools, longterm care facilities, etc.) remain relatively low. Please continue to take steps to protect yourself and those around you, including wearing your mask and washing our hands often and thoroughly. Remember this is not just for your safety, but the most vulnerable in our community. We know there is a need for healthy, social interactions, but please also keep in mind that limiting the people you interact with can help with critical contact tracing efforts.

On the Town website you can find updates we provide weekly, summarizing data from both Ledge Light Health District (LLHD) and CT Department of Public Health. We also attend weekly calls with State and local officials, which have been very helpful, offering a platform for sharing challenges faces and identifying solutions.

In addition to the physical health impacts, please know your mental health matters. There are a variety of resources for mental health support during this challenging time. The Town website has listed various resources available across the state, or call us at Human Services. We also know that social isolation can amplify issues at home. If you are concerned about a relationship and would like someone to talk to, call CT Safe Connect – (888) 774-2900. Safe Futures is also available 24/7 via their confidential crisis line (860) 701-6001. Please know, you are not alone.

If you would like assistance with grocery deliveries, pet supplies, or might benefit from a friendly checkin (they even do book drop offs), please visit www. stoningtonhelps.com or call us at Town Hall or Human Services. If you have any other needs, or know of others in need of assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out. We have many different options to assist residents in need.

The CDC also recommends positive ways to cope with stress, such as taking breaks from watching the news or reading about the pandemic; taking care of your body by being physically active; eating healthy; getting plenty of sleep; stretching or practicing meditation; staying engaged in activities you enjoy and staying connected to others even though we are physically distancing from each other. Spending time in nature, on trails, and other open spaces is another effective way to cope. Join Hike Stonington to find more local spots and be part of a community initiative.



While this is an extremely difficult time; it is also a time for us to show just how kind and strong we are, together as a community. Remember, even small actions, can make a big difference. If you are well and able, please think of friends, family and neighbors who might benefit from your help at this time, as well as our local non-profits and business.

During this time, we want to do everything we can to stay connected. Please remember to check our Town website for regular updates on a range of topics. Stonington Tax Collector

The 2nd installment of real estate and personal property (business-related) taxes may be paid any time between now and February 1st 2021. Taxpayers, please remember that we don't rebill for the 2nd installment.

Also, the tax office will begin collecting for the Pawcatuck Fire District toward the end of December 2020. From there on in, bills will be combined, and the town and fire district portions will be clearly marked on the bills. No more yellow bills!

The tax office will now collect for eleven fire districts: Pawcatuck, Stonington Borough, Stonington, Mystic, Wequetequock, Quiambaug, Old Mystic, Lord's Point, Mason's Island, Wamphassuc Point Association and Latimer Point. We transfer money to the fire districts once a month except for July when we transfer money more often.



CT HOME CARE FOR ELDERS

This CT Department of Social Services program assists the elderly by providing the support services needed so they may remain in the community, rather than in a long-term care facility. "To be eligible, applicants must be 65 years of age or older, be a Connecticut resident, be at risk of nursing home placement and meet the program's financial eligibility criteria. To be at risk of nursing home placement means that the applicant needs assistance with critical needs such as bathing, dressing, eating, taking medications, toileting. The CHCPE helps eligible clients continue living at home instead of going to a nursing home. Stonington Historical Society

Extended museum hours, an outdoor shadow performance for families, an online fundraiser featuring locally-made holiday wreaths, and a live-streamed harpsichord performance make the Stonington Historical Society a lively and local choice for seasonal activities.

The busy calendar begins the day after Thanksgiving on Friday, Nov. 27, when our two museums, The Lighthouse Museum and the Capt. Nathaniel Palmer House, reopen to visitors. Each weekend, on Fridays and Saturdays through Dec. 12, doors will be open from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., offering a rare opportunity to tour these historic sites during the winter months. Admission at either location is \$5 for adults; \$3 for children; and Historical Society members always get in free.

From 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. this brief play will begin every 15 minutes. Performances will be held five different nights, on Friday and Saturday evenings: Nov. 27 and Nov. 28; Dec. 4 and Dec. 5; and on Dec. 12. To further your holiday mood, the Stonington Historical Society will also be selling wreaths and other décor during our annual Deck the Walls fundraiser. This year's event will be held entirely online at deckthewalls. givesmart.com from Dec. 2 through Dec. 4. It is free to register and browse through the collection of handmade items. This event is held in cooperation with the Stonington Garden Club, and all proceeds benefit the Stonington Historical Society.

Lastly, on Dec. 11 is the return of our harpsichord concert featuring Elena Zamolodchikova. This onehour musical performance will be live-streamed from the Capt.
